Ms Claire McNaught is our 2024 Mary Strickland Award Recepient. As a staunch supporter of the Museum, serving as a weekly docent and a Friends of the Museum Board Member, we caught up with Claire and asked her about her role as a volutneer:

What motivated you to start volunteering at the Maritime museum?

I brought a visitor in to tour the museum and realized how little I knew of the local history. Given I had spent over forty years in NC and thought I knew it well, that was a wake up call. I figured the best way to learn was to join!

How long have you been with us and where did you originate from?

I am an Army brat who lived all over the world, but since 1976 I have been in the Pilot Mountain-Winston-Salem area. In 2015 I moved to Southport. I was a little late getting here, but I love being here!

What is the single greatest contribution this museum brings to the community? Gives us direct contact with our incredibly rich history.

What does the staff here excel at?

Teaching. They have a gift for sharing knowledge in a fun, stimulating way. I am constantly amazed at their breadth of information, from wartime Southport to native plants to dentistry. They are incredible!

Why do you think learning about Maritime history is important?

Because why Southport is what it is in 2025 is a direct result of the effect of commercial shipping and Blockade running of earlier centuries.

What are your hobbies?

I enjoy volunteering. I volunteer for the Southport historical society and Lower Cape Fear Life Care (hospice services). My dog, Louie, and I regularly partner as a pet therapy team at hospice.

What are you currently reading?

I just finished Atul Gawande's book "Being Mortal". A marvelous book I recommend to everyone.

What is an accomplishment you are really proud of?

I was given the Mary Strickland award. Mary is a valued friend and mentor. To be recognized in her honor was humbling.

What is your dream job?

I had it. I was the attorney for the police officers and firemen who worked for the City of Winston-Salem. Of no job could it have been truer than that one to say....never a dull day!

How did you find out about volunteering at the museum? By visiting the museum.

What qualities does a good museum volunteer possess?

Be a good listener. Observant, look for signs of how the visitor can use your help. Pay attention to what the staff is prioritizing and what they say. Every shift is a learning opportunity. Be proud of the facility. Show off the museum at its best. It's a jewel and every volunteer has a stake in

I look forward to more on WWII in our area.


What museum attraction is most favored by the children? The scavenger hunts By the adults? The periscope By you? The John D. Gill exhibit

Mr. Davis was the keeper of the Cape Fear Life Saving Station, then transferred to be the first keeper of Oak Island Life Saving Station. He is best know for "the Longest Day." FUN FACT!

MAY 22ND IS NATIONAL MARITIME DAY!

In 1933, by a joint resolution, Congress declares May 22md to be National Maritime Day. The significance of this date is that in 1819, the steamship Savannah sailed from Savannah, Georgia to Liverpool, England on the first successful transoceanic voyage under steam propulsion, thus making a material contribution to the advancement of ocean transportation. This resolution authorizes the President to annually issue a proclamation calling upon the people of the United States to observe National Maritime Day by displaying the flag at their homes or other suitable places and Government officials to display the flag on all Government buildings on May 22nd each year.
